

CCF Cambodia Medical Ministry Report

Winter 2008

I have been in Cambodia for seven weeks now. It has been a very different experience this time and I am excited to see how the Lord is growing and refining this ministry (and myself). A couple of songs have not left my head for weeks now. Over and over I keep hearing “ask and you will receive”, “ask and I’ll give the nations to you”. “We speak to nations ‘be open...fall on your knees’. We speak to strongholds ‘be broken’ and to powers of darkness ‘you have to leave’”.

So, I find myself going about asking for Cambodia. Each face I see, all who come to me for help, all who watch me as I pass by, each bright little smile and voice that says “hello”, I ask for these in Jesus name.

The clinics have been going very well. I do a few each week and have seen about 545 men, women and children so far. We pray together before we begin, talk to them about Jesus and pray for each person individually after we see them. Two RNs from Australia visited on Monday and helped out with 2 clinics. They said they hope to come back.

I visited one lady who had a baby about three months ago and has had very high blood pressure and been very sick ever since. She said that she was just waiting to die because there was no one to help her and she had no money. She is living in the smallest, worst hut I have seen. Usually these people come to the clinics but I don’t really see their living situations. I have made more home visits this time and it has opened my eyes even more to what we are up against here.

My goals for the next few weeks are:

- Do more education on basic health and hygiene
- Do more research on the natural resources available to help and heal
- Continue holding clinics in the villages surrounding A Greater Hope
- Pray without ceasing

I would like to thank each of you for your commitment to missions and your continued effort to make all of our mission’s efforts at CCF successful.

May the God of hope continue to bless you as you serve Him.
